

Revitalising Health for All: Learning from Comprehensive Primary Health Care Experiences



CPHC Literature Review

The monumental exercise of reviewing scientific and grey literature on CPHC experiences across the world has begun. The literature has been divided by geographic region among some twenty researchers. Articles, reports and books are being reviewed and each region will submit a synthesis paper reporting the conclusions of these reviews. Draft regional synthesis papers will be submitted by 15 October and final papers submitted by 12 November.

Inclusion criteria for literature review

The literature we are reviewing must address one or more components which qualify primary health care as being 'comprehensive':

- ❑ equitable access to basic health care
- ❑ integration of rehabilitative, curative, preventive and health promotion components
- ❑ community involvement / citizen participation
- ❑ collaboration with / involvement of other sectors
- ❑ action on social determinants (non-medical determinants) of health
- ❑ incorporation of a rights-based approach (e.g. reference to programs or actions undertaken in response to obligations of governments under the right to health, or to human rights obligations more generally)
- ❑ explicit value of health equity ('levelling up health status')

CPHC training program under development

We are beginning the groundwork for the CPHC training program which will run over a period of 3 years (2008-2010) in 4 parts of the world. The overall purpose of the training program is to develop local capacity to support CPHC practice and, in particular, to initiate and support a program of new research on critical issues facing CPHC development and sustainability in participating countries. Regional training programs in India will extend to others in South Asia; programs in South Africa will focus first on South Africa, Tanzania and Zimbabwe; and programs in Latin America (country to be confirmed) will focus first on El Salvador, Nicaragua, Bolivia, Ecuador, Colombia and Brazil. There will also be training programs in Australia/Canada (with a focus on Aboriginal peoples in these two countries and New Zealand).

We are currently drafting the call for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) to participate in these regional training programs. We will send you the final version as well as post it on relevant sites. Participants should be paired in dyads consisting of a junior researcher (with a senior research mentor) and research users (e.g. program managers, policy workers, with some research experience). Dyads from any of the participating countries may apply. We may be calling on you, as collaborators on this project, to assist in the selection of applicants, to contribute as faculty in the regional training programs and to help us locate senior research mentors if the junior researcher is unable to do so him/herself.

Meeting of the management committee in November 2007

David Sanders and Ron Labonte, as co-principal investigators, and the regional supervisors of the literature review who will also largely be responsible for organizing the regional training programs, will meet in Johannesburg, South

Africa from 28 November to 2 December. The purpose of this meeting is to review the outcomes of the literature reviews and to plan the content and logistics of the regional training programs.
